Modern Language Requirement.....0-8 (**May be taken at OSU-OKC**)*

All students completing a B.A. in Political Science shall complete the first two semesters of a second language. Students may alternatively fulfill the language requirement by proof of academic work in the second language (CLEP test through LANG 1224), four years of high school language courses, or transfer work from another institution.

***A minimum of 60 hours must be taken from a baccalaureate granting institution. See your academic advisor about advisable limits on taking these courses. While these courses may be taken at NOC, taking too many of them would result in taking more hours at UCO than the minimum. A good general guideline would be a limit of 64 total hours from a community college.**
